American homeowners might be eligible for federal tax credits for solar installations or state subsidies for solar energy, but not free panels. The U.S. government does not provide free solar panels, said a U.S. Department of Energy spokesperson. The department urges people to report scams to the .

Here are some of the most common solar panel scams to watch out for: Fake government incentives: Be aware of companies claiming to offer free solar panels through government subsidies or grants. Check the legitimacy of their claims by researching local or national incentives on your own.

Are free solar panels worth it?

"Free" solar panels will save you money because energy from solar power is usually less expensive than energy from the electrical grid. Keep in mind, however, that these savings from solar energy are possible regardless of if your solar panels are leased versus purchased. Free solar panels from the federal government? Not so fast -- it could be a consumer scam. Millions of Americans are deciding to power their homes with solar energy and take advantage of its numerous benefits, including cost-savings on electricity bills that accrue over the lifetime of the solar system.
