



# Idaho power solar net metering

Is Idaho Power proposing new net metering rules?

Idaho Power published a customer-sited generation study on June 30 , advancing the regulatory process to propose new net metering rules.

Will Idaho switch to a net-billing system?

The Idaho Public Utilities Commission (PUC) approved on Dec. 29,2023,a shift to a net-billing system instead of compensation based on a kilowatt-hour-for-kilowatt-hour basis for solar system owners.

Is Idaho Power undervaluing rooftop solar?

Idaho Power proposed cutting solar rates based on an internally produced " Value of Distributed Energy Resources Study ." Sierra Club and other environmental groups hired an independent analyst that concluded Idaho Power was severely undervaluing rooftop solar's valueby using selective data.

Unlike Rocky Mountain Power, Idaho Power's transition to net billing lowered the value of credits, meaning you won't save as much on your electric bills with solar panels now.



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The Idaho Public Service Commission (PSC) has amended an earlier ruling from its December 2019 decision to deny Idaho Power's net metering replacement rates, deeming that the "grandfathered" net-metering rate given to a system installed before the date of that decision is applied to the installation and not the customer.
