**THE RENEWABLE ENERGY TRANSITION AND SOLVING THE STORAGE PROBLEM: A LOOK AT JAPAN**  
The rapid growth of renewable energy in Japan raises new challenges regarding intermittency of power generation and grid connection and stability. Storage technologies have the potential to resolve these issues

Does Japan have a power storage system?

Japan is leading the way in technological development and dissemination of power storage systems in its efforts to expand the use of fuel cells and Ene-Farms. Ene-Farm, a fuel cell that utilizes hydrogen, was commercialized in Japan in 2009 for the first time in the world. As of June 2021, more than 400,000 units have been installed.

Does Japan have a solar power plant?

New-build renewable power plants in Japan include an energy storage component. The two largest solar PV power plants in Hokkaido, commissioned in July and October 2020, respectively, both include lithium ion batteries. One plant has a generating capacity of 64.6MWp and battery output of 19.0MWh,

What happens if Japan loses a stable supply of energy?

If anything happens in these regions, a stable supply of energy for Japan will be jeopardized. In order to secure a stable supply in such an emergency, Japan holds oil stocks equivalent to approximately 230 days of its domestic demand and diversifies the regions it imports from.

When will electric storage batteries be available in Japan?

Starting in fiscal 2026, the trade of this type of electricity stored in residential storage batteries will be facilitated in a dedicated market. Tesla has a head start here. It started building virtual power plants in Japan with its Powerwall batteries in 2021.

Indeed, the government's three-year Basic Energy Plan aims for renewables to reach 22-24% of the national energy mix by that year. That would peg solar's share at around 64GW.
