

Sephiroth destroys solar system

The Supernova will destroy the dimensional space and bring despair; So yeah. Solar System Level is pretty straight forward for Sephiroth with MFTL+ speeds based on essentially upscaling from all characters and Summons such as Bahamut Fury who moves this fast. But you can get higher than that.

Doesn't Sephiroth have an attack that destroys the entire solar system multiple times? Depending how canon that is he might win. ... or just use better magic than Sephiroth is packing - he's one of the leading candidates for a replacement Sorcerer Supreme. Even without pulling the esoteric stuff, Doom is just more powerful to a huge degree. Reply

He fights with illusions, at one point he appears to do no less than temporarily destroy the entire solar system. This fight is full of ironies. Even in his "perfect body", Sephiroth is still missing his legs. Literally half a man, Sephiroth now wears a fake halo and a model star - in his grandest illusion, his godhood is only a costume. It ...

Supernova shows that Sephiroth can destroy planets, but it is not his goal in the story. As for it destroying our solar system, this is likely because he transported the party to an alternate dimension. This is similar to summons. Crisis Core and Word of God say how summons drag their targets into an alternate dimension.

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The Japanese version also does the same thing but even if it does not destroy the Sun it still annihilates every planet in the Solar System and does not do %damage. And you literally cannot have an attack in a game which would one shot all of the players characters for the simple reason that it would make the boss fight near impossible to win.

Sephiroth is only like solar system level because of his supernova and if we take Sephiroth folding Galeem in one shot Dante still has the better feats because he defeated characters as op as Galeem multiple times. ... Eg Nightmare CAN/COULD lift and destroy the demon realm (never happened), creating a universe does not mean you have universal ...

Then, we see Sephiroth destroy the entire Solar System with a single attack. The problem with assuming that this makes Sephiroth a Solar System level character, is that it doesn't make sense.

Supernova - Sephiroth's ultimate attack; In one very long attack, Sephiroth destroys an entire solar system and channels that power into his targets. This attack is infamous for not making any sense, but we've actually been given pretty concrete explanations for how it works in Ultimania and other games.

R3: Sephiroth 10/10 This is where it get's absolutely flipped on it's head, Sephiroth literally destroys an entire solar system, based on Sephiroth anime-level speed, he could literally pull this off faster than Sangunnius has enough time to react.
